Aim: To modernize agricultural education in Togo, Nigeria and Kenya by fostering a more holistic and human-centered approach to agricultural education, training and innovation.

SO 1) To develop competence-based master program on FVC at 6 partner HEIs;

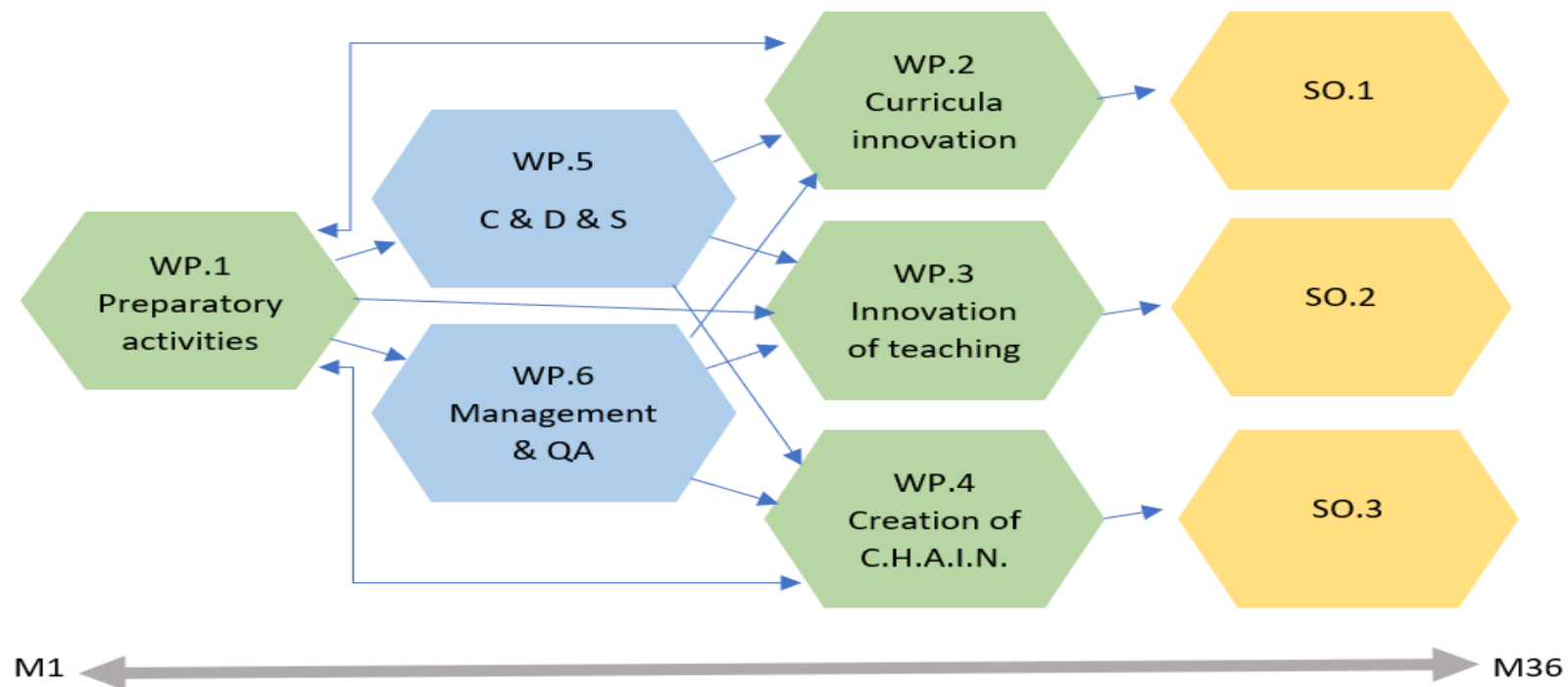
SO 2) To build teacher capacity at 6 partner HEIs from rural and remote areas to promote learning methods and use teaching methodology prone to entrepreneurial thinking and innovation, with emphasis on e-learning and digital tools;

SO 3) In cooperation with private sector to establish Collaborative Holistic Agriculture Innovation Nests (CHAINS) at 6 partner HEIs and offer support to innovation initiatives of students, farmers, and entrepreneurs, enhancing their employability, sense of initiative and entrepreneurship.

Aim: To support partner Higher Education Institutions in Senegal, Togo and Uganda in improving the relevance and inclusiveness of higher education.

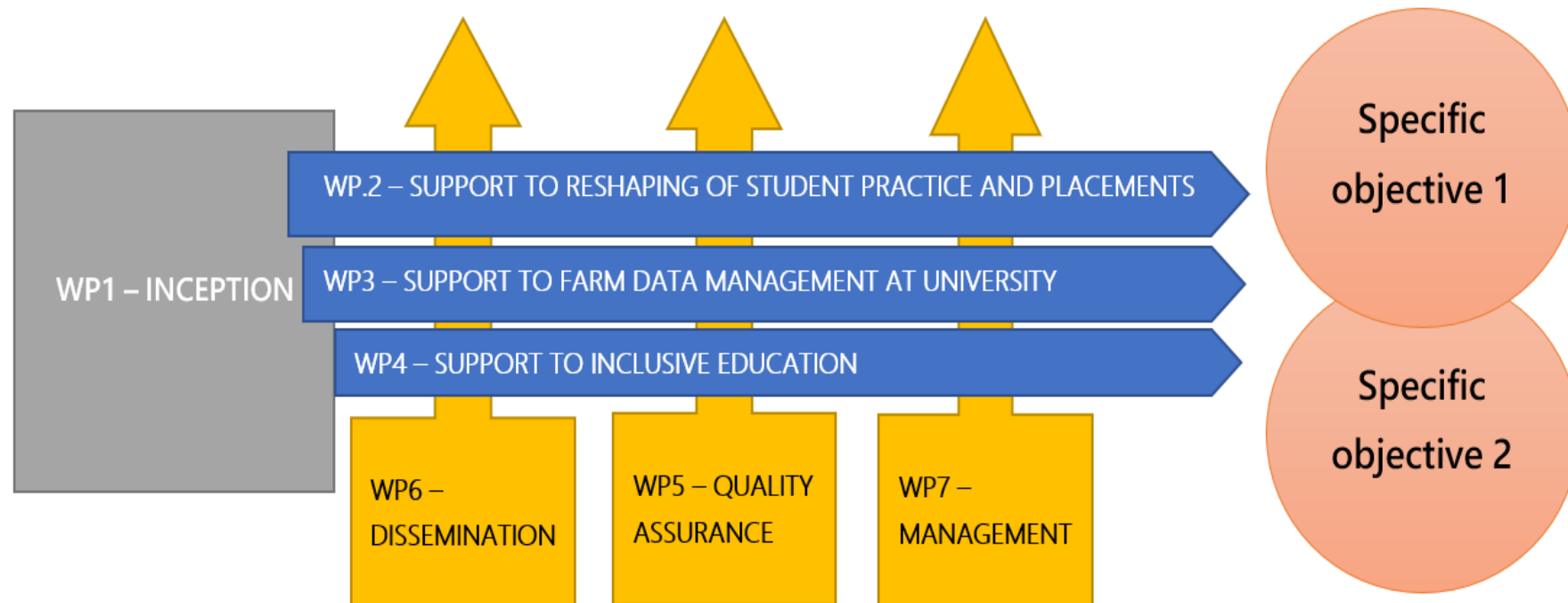
SO 1) To reshape student practice and shift it from teaching to competence-based practical work, and introduce farm placements to enhance student employability;
